The criteria for selecting scholarship recipients include a high scholastic record with a recommended minimum 3.5 cumulative GPA.

The Kennesaw State University Chapter is eligible to nominate **any exemplary and qualified members** for scholarship consideration. The National Office deadline for ALL applications is May 1, 2020; however, our campus has an **internal deadline** of **April 26, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.** for application review and recommendation for the National competition. Per National Phi Eta Sigma scholarship rules, applications **MUST BE** approved by the Chapter Adviser. Once an application is submitted online, no further edits or changes can be made to the application.

Prepare your responses to the six(6) prompts below in a Word file, paying attention to the space limitations given for the response. The questions are formed to show an applicant's

- Involvement in Phi Eta Sigma
- Participation in other service and leadership organizations and projects
- Creative ability
- Plans for continued academic studies

Proofread your answers carefully. Send your responses with the required demographic information (i.e., name, address, phone contact, campus email address, year of induction, academic major, cumulative GPA, and expected graduation date) to Ms. Janice Malone, via email: Jmalon17@kennesaw.edu.

You do not need to send any academic transcript. KSU student records will be secured by Phi Eta Sigma and attached to your application for review.

Letters of recommendation can be submitted with your application; however, letters of recommendation are not required.

Your application will be reviewed by a local scholarship award committee comprised of KSU faculty and staff. The committee will make its recommendations for the most exemplary and qualified applications that can be submitted to the National competition.

We strongly recommend that you prepare your responses to the six essay questions below using a word processing document and keeping in mind the character limits specified below for each question.

1) Describe your plans for academic study (disciplines and schools, how you plan to use your education, etc.). Make sure to note any unusual aspects of your academic plans (e.g., December graduation, enrollment in a joint degree program, change of schools, internships or externships, etc.). **1700** character limit *

2) List and describe your academic achievements (such as scholarships & awards, induction into other honor societies or elite groups/organizations). **1700** character limit *

3) Describe your specific individual volunteer (i.e., unpaid) **contributions to Phi Eta Sigma** at the chapter, regional, and/or national level.

4) Describe your specific individual volunteer (i.e., unpaid) **contributions to organizations or activities** (community, professional, leadership, co-curricular, etc.) **other than Phi Eta Sigma. 3600** character limit *

6) Summarize your work experience (on/off-campus work, internship), and include the experience gained and any contributions made. **3600** character limit *
